HOLY FACE OF JESUS DEVOTION: Occurs on the first Tuesday of every month. The primary purpose of the devotion to Jesus' Holy Face is to make reparation for sins against the first three Commandments: The denial of God (atheism/communism); blasphemy; and the profanation of Sundays and Holy Days. This devotion is also a weapon against Freemasonry. Devotion will be on Tuesday, **June 3rd** at 4.00pm followed by Benediction, Rosary, and Mass at 5.30pm.



FIRST FRIDAY DEVOTIONS: There will be two Masses on Friday, **June 6th** for community members to make their First Friday devotions. Cards will be placed at the church entrance and intentions can be placed in the box near the communion rails. When you go to Mass and receive Communion for nine consecutive First Fridays you receive special graces as Our Lord promised St. Margret Mary Alacoque when He appeared to her in the 17th century. FIRST SATURDAY DEVOTIONS: The origins of First Saturday began on December 10th, 1925 when Our Lady appeared to Sr. Lucia of Fatima. The requirements of this devotion are: Confession, which can be done up to 8 days before First Saturday; Attend Mass and receive Holy Communion; pray 5 decades of the Rosary; and meditate on the 15 decades of the Rosary for 15 minutes. Complete the requirements for the intention of blasphemies and offenses against the Immaculate Heart of Mary for five consecutive First Saturdays to receive special graces. According to the Institute's Instagram account, the initiative 'aims to make the rich heritage of Gregorian chant accessible to all—a universal musical and spiritual language for celebrations such as papal Masses and to promote active and conscious participation in the liturgy. The Institute was established by St Pius X in 1910 to educate and train musicians in plainchant, organ and the rich musical heritage of the Church.

St Anne's Belmont supports the vision of making the Church's rich plainchant heritage accessible to all through customised booklets for congregational singing of the Mass Ordinary. Everyone is invited to sing the bolded sections each week and in so doing to fulfil an essential role at the Solemn Mass.
