Playing the organ during the Last Gospel?

Some questions may arise as to why the organ may be played during the Last Gospel (more correctly called the 'Gospel of St John' according to the rubrics of the 1962 Missal). The *legislative answer* is that the practice is explicitly permitted in Pius XII's *De Music et de Sacra Liturgia* (1958) at paragraph 29d.

The *liturgical answer* is somewhat more complex. Some of the prayers in the Tridentine Missal are said by the celebrant for all present, others are prayers for the celebrant and the sacred ministers, and others still are for the celebrant alone (this will be the subject of some columns in this bulletin in future weeks). The Last Gospel falls into the category of prayers intended for the celebrant alone.

The rubrics for Solemn Mass instruct the priest to recite the Last Gospel in a low voice (at General Rubric 513), rather than loudly for the entire congregation to hear. In fact, at a Pontifical Mass, a bishop is not required to recite the Last Gospel in the sanctuary at all; he may choose to do so in procession back to the sacristy instead. The General Rubrics of the *Missale Romanum* even permit the priest to omit the 'Dominus vobiscum' and 'Initium...' where 'customary' (at XIII). It is clear, therefore, that the Last Gospel is a private prayer of the celebrant and forms part of his personal thanksgiving after Mass. While the celebrant makes his own after-Mass thanksgiving in this way, it may be appropriate for the members of the congregation to make their own thanksgivings privately as well.
