

SEPTUAGESIMATIDE

We are now in the Septuagesima season of the liturgical year. The season was abolished with the Vatican II reforms but it is still practiced in the Traditional Rite. There are three Sundays which accompany this season – Septuagesima, Sexagesima, and Quinquagesima. The three Sundays are named after 70, 60 and 50 days, respectively to the nearest ten, before Easter. The main liturgical differences that you may note is that the Alleluia is replaced by the Tract and the Gloria is omitted from Sunday Mass until Easter. The main purpose of Septuagesima is to give all faithful the opportunity to prepare for Lent which begins on Ash Wednesday on **February 18th**. Just like it would be unreasonable to perform in an exam if you had no preparation, or competing in a competitive sport without a warm-up or training, it would be unreasonable to expect Catholics to immediately adjust from the celebrations of Christmastide and Epiphany to Lent on Ash Wednesday. Therefore, it is important to use this season as a time to ask the Lord what your prayer, fasting, and almsgiving is going to look like during Lent. Septuagesimatide allows you to plan, but also trial your plans to make sure they are realistic. For example, is it realistic to wake up earlier in the morning to increase your time in prayer? It is therefore important to start your Lenten preparations early to give yourself a deeper relationship with the Lord during this Lenten season.



ST. ANNE'S MUSIC

The Mass setting for the next two Sundays is **Mass XI** with **Credo I**. The Gloria is now omitted as we enter Septuagesimataide. The Marian Antiphon is the **Alma Redemptoris Mater** this Sunday and changes to the **Ave Regina Caelorum** next Sunday. **Everyone is invited to join in all the sections in the booklets marked in bold.**

Questions on Music and Liturgy: *Why are there different plainchant settings of the Mass Ordinary?*

There are many plainchant settings of the Mass Ordinary in the *Kyriale*—for example, Mass IV, which includes the Kyrie, Gloria, Sanctus, and Agnus Dei. In most cases, these settings were not composed as a single musical whole. Instead, they are groupings of chants that come from different times and places. The idea of composing a “Mass” as one unified musical setting developed much later, becoming clear only in the high Renaissance, around the time of the Council of Trent. For this reason, the combinations of chants within a given Mass have not always been fixed, and some groupings have changed over time.

In its present form, the *Kyriale* shows the Church’s long-standing practice of recommending, rather than requiring, certain settings of the Ordinary for particular seasons or types of feast. For example, Mass XI is used on Sundays throughout the year; Mass IX is linked with feasts of the Blessed Virgin Mary; and Mass I is appointed for Paschaltide. These indications are both practical and meaningful. They help to express the character of each season and assist the faithful in entering more deeply into the Church’s liturgical life.

With regard to the Creed, it is worth noting that Credo I has long been regarded as the principal or normative setting in the *Kyriale*, while other settings are permitted. This reflects the Church’s concern that the profession of faith remain stable and recognisable, while allowing a considered diversity in its musical expression.
