ST ANNE'S NOTICES



ASH WEDNESDAY: All community members are reminded that Lent begins this Wednesday, **February 18th**. Ash Wednesday is one of two days in the liturgical year where all Catholics are obligated to **fast** and **abstain from meat**. This year, the Archbishop of Perth has granted an exemption to Catholics celebrating the second day of Chinese New Year.



STATIONS OF THE CROSS: Come meditate on the Passion of Our Lord Jesus Christ every Friday evening during Lent. The Stations of the Cross will be prayed at 5:30pm followed by Low Mass at 6:15pm. Fr. Limbourn will hear Confessions starting at 5:00pm.

EMBER DAYS IN LENT: Traditionally observed as special periods of prayer, fasting, and abstinence. They are linked to the seasons and mark times of prayer, reflection, and seeking God's blessing for the harvest and good weather. Ember Days traditionally occur the week after; 1. Ash Wednesday, 2. Pentecost 3. The Exaltation of the Holy Cross (September 14th), and 4. The Feast of St. Lucia (December 13th). Though the culture has become more urban and less agrarian, the value of the Ember Days has not diminished. It would be most beneficial to reclaim them to regulate our spiritual routines. As you discern observing the Ember Days into your spiritual routine, know that Our Lady is by your side, helping you to honour Our Lord.

ST. ANNE'S MUSIC

The Mass setting for this Sunday is **Mass XI** with **Credo I**. From the First Sunday of Lent, we sing **Mass XVII** with **Credo III**, with the Lent Prose, **Attende Domine** at the Offertory. The Marian remains the **Ave Regina Caelorum** next Sunday. **Everyone is invited to join in all the sections in the booklets marked in bold.**

The use of the organ on the Sundays of Lent (apart from the Fourth Sunday, when the discipline is relaxed) is limited to accompanying the singing; the Church's legislation prohibits the use of the organ as an ornament to the liturgy in penitential seasons (Advent and Lent) and in Requiem Masses.

Questions on Music and Liturgy: *If hymns are not used in the solemn celebration of the Mass, it is reasonable to ask: where do they belong?*

Traditionally, vernacular hymns have played an important role in the Church's devotional life. They are especially linked with Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament, processions, novenas, and other devotions outside Mass. For many centuries, hymn books were written mainly for these occasions. Many of these hymns are beautiful and have helped generations of Catholics to pray.

Hymns also became common at Low Mass. At a Low Mass the priest does not sing the texts of the Mass, and the people often joined in hymns or other prayers while the Mass was being said quietly. In this setting, hymns were a practical and helpful way for the congregation to take part in prayer.

Problems arose when this custom was carried over into the Solemn Mass. Instead of singing the words of the Mass itself, people sang hymns instead. Over time, many came to think that singing at Mass simply means singing hymns, and that chant is something only the choir does.

This is the imbalance that Pope St Pius X and the early liturgical movement tried to fix. Their goal was not to ban hymns, but to put the focus back on the Solemn Mass, which is the full expression of the Church's liturgical vision. Gregorian chant is encouraged because it is the normative music of the Roman Rite.

Restoring this balance is still important. Chant—especially the Ordinary of the Mass—is meant to be sung by everyone. Hymns remain valuable in devotions and at Low Mass, but at a sung Mass the Church invites us to sing the Mass itself.
