**Questions on Music & Liturgy: Is it realistic to expect a modern congregation to learn and sing Gregorian Chant at Mass? (Continued)**

It is absolutely possible for modern congregation to sing Gregorian Chant at Mass! From Brussels, to Rome, Paris, London and beyond, the ‘Gregorian Mass’ remains a feature of liturgical life in churches using both the Missals of 1962 and 1969. Across the world, Catholic congregations continue to take their rightful part in singing the Ordinary of the Mass.

In some ways, there have never been more resources to assist with learning the different Mass settings. To give one example, Corpus Christi Watershed website offers a treasure trove of free resources designed for beginners and experienced singers alike. There are easy-to-follow videos with scores so that you can follow along and then ‘sing along’. Preparing for the coming Sunday mass is one way to sing (and so pray) the mass with greater ease. If all this was possible then—without modern technology, recordings, or online tutorials—it is certainly possible now. (See: [ccwatershed.org/kyriale/](http://ccwatershed.org/kyriale/))

*Regular listening* can also make a significant difference. For many of us, chant is heard only once a week at Mass. There are many fine choirs and recordings to choose between to begin to absorb the melodies and phrasing of the Mass settings. One good one is ‘Gregoriana Monacensis’, a specialist German vocal ensemble. If you listen to their recording of the Kyriale Romanum III (EOS, 2023), you will recognise the settings we are currently singing.
