### FR. LIMBOURN ON THE VIRTUE OF MODESTY

In his letter to the Galatians, St. Paul lists modesty as one of the fruits of the Holy Spirit, those “perfections that the Holy Spirit forms in us as the first fruits of eternal glory.” (See Galatians 5:22-23) It is a virtue that moderates all the internal and external movements and appearance of a person according to his or her endowments possessions and station in life.

Modesty in dress and general behaviour is governed by the principle of not offending others and not being an occasion of sin for others. A modest person will respect the knowledge that he or she is made in the image and likeness of God, safeguarding body and soul, and thereby the physical and spiritual dimensions of the human being. It guides how one looks at others and behaves towards them in conformity with the dignity of the person, encourages patience and decency, offers good example, and reminds all of us of our responsibility to guide and train our little ones to embrace the joy of the Catholic faith.

**Questions on Music & Liturgy: Why does the sung liturgy here sound different from what I remember—whether from recent years or decades ago?**

You may have noticed some changes in the way the liturgy is sung at St Anne's. These developments reflect a deepened understanding of the Church's musical tradition, along with access to richer resources and clearer guidance.

In particular, we now alternate the chanting of the Ordinary of the Mass between the Schola and the congregation, in accordance with the

instructions of the Graduale Romanum. It has been especially encouraging to hear the congregation increasingly take up its rightful role in singing the texts of the Mass—something that is a hallmark of the Church’s liturgical life in many places.


You may also notice the organ being used more independently. The practice of organ improvisation between the sung parts of the Mass (the Ordinary and the Propers) is not a modern innovation, but part of a living tradition spanning centuries. From the alternatim practices of the Renaissance through to the great French liturgical organists such as Charles Tournemire, Louis Vierne, and Marcel Dupré, the organ has long served to reflect, extend, and illuminate the chant of the Church. Improvisation, in particular, allows the organist to draw out the character of the liturgical texts and seasons in a way that is both rooted in tradition and responsive to the moment.

Restricting the organ solely to accompanying singing is more characteristic of penitential seasons and Requiem liturgies. At other times, its fuller, more independent role helps to frame and enrich the Church’s prayer.

The custom of singing a hymn at the end of a solemn Mass in Australia appears to have arisen from practical limitations—namely, a lack of suitable instruments and trained organists—rather than from the Church’s liturgical tradition. In places where a strong organ culture has long existed, such a practice never took hold. With the resources now available at St Anne’s, this custom gives way to the more fitting practice of organ voluntaries, in continuity with the Church’s heritage.
