Questions on Music & Liturgy: What music is permitted during the silent recitation of the Canon of the Mass?

The principal music during the Canon is that which is prescribed by the rite itself: the Sanctus. When sung in plainchant, it properly belongs to both choir and congregation and is never be treated as the preserve of the choir alone. When sung in polyphony, it is split into two separate movements, with the Sanctus preceding the consecration and the Benedictus following it.


Liturgical music during the Canon of the Mass has undergone significant developments in recent centuries, noting that even the organist of St Peter's Basilica Girolamo Frescobaldi, (from 1608 to 1628 and again from 1634 until his death in 1643), composed Elevazioni for this liturgical purpose.

Former permissions to sing a motet to the Blessed Sacrament after the elevations have long since been withdrawn. The most recent legislation indicates that a 'devout silence' is to be recommended from the Consecration until the Pater Noster.

As to the use of the organ, the legislation of Pope Pius XII is precise. At Low Mass, the organ may be played gravely and reverently (in accord with the instruction De Musica Sacra) after the celebrant has recited the Sanctus but must cease before the consecration.
