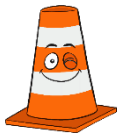

## ST ANNE'S NOTICES



**LOST PROPERTY:** The lost property shelf in the back porch of the presbytery is filling up. **A clean out of the shelf will occur on Wednesday, July 1<sup>st</sup> where all unclaimed property that is still in good condition will be donated to the local Vinnies.** If you have lost a particular item, please check the shelf to see if it is there before July 1<sup>st</sup>.



**PROPERTY WORKS AT ST ANNE'S:** Please be aware of the following works taking place over the month of June:

1. ***Presbytery:*** The Archdiocese of Perth property tradesmen have begun on the presbytery bathroom. Works on the laundry and confessional will begin soon. This work is being completed so the property meets safeguarding standards.
2. ***Southern Carpark:*** Soak wells are to be installed beginning on Monday, **June 22<sup>nd</sup>** near the church and carpark is to be levelled and laid with new asphalt. Remedial works will also be done on the gap between the church and the nursing home fence. **The Southern Carpark will be closed on Sunday, June 28<sup>th</sup>.** Please plan accordingly.
3. ***Outside Shelter:*** Blinds are being installed on the outside shelter of the church to protect community members from strong winds and rains during Mass.

**CENACLE:** There will be an extended period for everyone in the St. Anne's community to adore the Blessed Sacrament on Friday, **July 3<sup>rd</sup>**. Adoration will begin immediately after the 9.00am Mass and will conclude with Benediction at 5.00pm. At 4.00pm, Fr. Limbourn will be leading the Cenacle prayer for the Marian Movement of Priests which includes Rosary, Litany of Our Lady, reading and quiet prayer.



**FIRST FRIDAY DEVOTION:** There will be two Masses on Friday, **July 3<sup>rd</sup>** for community members to make their First Friday devotion. When you go to Mass and receive Communion (if in the state of grace) with the intention of honouring Our Lord's Most Sacred Heart for nine consecutive First Fridays you receive special graces of perseverance and a peaceful death as Our Lord promised St. Margret Mary Alacoque when He appeared to her in the 17<sup>th</sup> century. To enhance the devotion you may also like to spend time in Adoration of Our Blessed Lord, make an Act of Reparation to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and pray the Litany of the Sacred Heart.

**FIRST SATURDAY DEVOTION:** The origins of the First Saturday devotion began on December 10<sup>th</sup>, 1925 when Our Lady appeared to Sr. Lucia of Fatima. The intention for devotion is for the offences and blasphemies against the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The requirements of this devotion are:



1. **Confession.** You can receive the Sacrament of Penance eight days either before or after First Saturday to complete this requirement. You do not need to go to confession on the day, but it is available half an hour before Mass if you need it.
2. **Attend Mass** and receive Holy Communion (if in a state of grace).
3. **Pray 5 decades of the Rosary.** The community Rosary prayed approximately half an hour before Mass is sufficient.
4. **Meditate on the mysteries of the Rosary for 15 minutes.** The Church is open after Mass to help you complete this requirement.

Complete the devotion for five consecutive First Saturdays to receive the grace of a peaceful death. One may continue the devotion for the sinners of the world and for the peace that Our Blessed Mother brings to the world.

## ST. ANNE'S MUSIC

The Mass setting for the next two Sundays is **Mass XI** with **Credo I**. The **Asperges Me** and **Salve Regina** will be sung as usual. **Everyone is invited to join in all the sections in the booklets marked in bold.**

**Music & Liturgy: Why does the priest recite the same texts (like the Introit and Offertory) that the choir is singing during a Sung Mass?**

In the sung liturgy, the duplication of texts sung by the choir by the priest is a relatively recent innovation, dating to the post-Tridentine Roman Rite in the 1500s. This change was in fact resisted by the Dominicans, Cistercians and others in their own rites. The older structure of Western liturgies, where the ministers made their own private preparation during the liturgical procession to the sanctuary or holy place, reveals the truer order: the principal liturgical action is the song of the choir, and the ministers' preparatory prayers are subordinated to this, rather than opposed to it or in competition with it.

The same pattern appears in the Communion rite, where the Communion chant accompanies the private preparation of all for the reception of Holy Communion. Likewise, the Offertory chant is of ancient origin and operates, as it were, as a kind of “veil” over the priest’s offertory prayers, not as a rival to them.


To set the sung propers of the liturgy in conflict with the prayers of the priest is therefore a grave mistake, and it tends to foster the further error that the choir is somehow external to, or optional in relation to, the liturgical action itself. As Pope Pius X taught in his motu proprio on sacred music, “sacred music... forms an integral part of the solemn liturgy” (Tra le Sollecitudini, 1903).

A large part of the blame for this misperception lies in later devotional and practical developments: the proliferation of low Mass, with its muted or absent chant, and the wide availability of printed hand missals encouraged a “text-reading” rather than “rite-hearing” and “chant-participating” experience of Mass. From this perspective, the liturgy can come to seem like a telescope viewed through the wrong end: the quieter, private prayers of the priest loom largest, while the older, processional, and musical structure of the rite recedes into the background, when in fact the sung propers and chants are integral to the Church’s public worship.
