**HOLY FACE OF JESUS DEVOTION:** Occurs on the first Tuesday of every month. The primary purpose of the devotion to Jesus' Holy Face is to make reparation for sins against the first three Commandments: The denial of God (atheism/communism); blasphemy, and the profanation of Sundays and Holy Days. This devotion is also a weapon against Freemasonry. Devotion will be on **Tuesday, June 2<sup>nd</sup>** at 4.00pm followed by Benediction, Rosary, and Mass at 5:30pm.



**CENACLE:** There will be an extended period for everyone in the St. Anne's community to adore the Blessed Sacrament on Friday, **June 5<sup>th</sup>**. Adoration will begin immediately after the 9.00am Mass and will conclude with Benediction at 5.00pm. At 4.00pm, Fr. Limbourn will be leading the Cenacle prayer for the Marian Movement of priests which includes Rosary, Litany of Our Lady, reading and quiet prayer.



**EMBER DAYS IN PENTECOST:** Traditionally observed as special periods of prayer, fasting, and abstinence linked to the changing liturgical and calendar seasons. The intention behind these days is to thank God for the harvest He gives – through nature, vocations, and conversion of sinners. While the practice of Ember days is no longer mandatory by the Church since Vatican II, it is still encouraged.



**EXTERNAL SOLEMNITY OF CORPUS CHRISTI:** St. Anne's will celebrate the First-Class Feast of Corpus Christi on Sunday, **June 7<sup>th</sup>** at all four holy Masses. Following the 9.30am Mass there will be a procession to the Grotto, weather permitting, for Benediction. Following the 11.30am Mass there will be an extended time of Eucharistic Adoration in the church concluding with Benediction at 4.30pm.

**Music & Liturgy: Some reflections of Cardinal Ratzinger**

This week, our column takes an overarching look at the role of each individual in the congregation who assists at Mass interiorly – but also exteriorly through song. Cardinal Ratzinger wrote that, along with contemplative stillness and silence, the human voice has 'an essential role to play' in the liturgy.


‘The structure of Word and response, which is essential to the liturgy, is modelled on the basic structure of the process of divine revelation, in which Word and response, the speech of God and the receptive hearing of the Bride, the Church, go together... For example, there is the acclamation (“shout”)... [which] confirms the arrival of the Word and makes the process of revelation, of God’s giving himself in the Word, at last complete. The Amen, the Alleluia, and the *Et cum spiritu tuo*, and so on, are all part of this... The people really do again respond... God, the Revealer, did not want to stay as *solus Deus, solus Christus* (God alone, Christ alone). No, he wanted to create a Body for himself, to find a Bride—he sought a response.’

Participating in the Gregorian chant of the mass, which in the Church’s own liturgical law is described as ‘specially suited to the Roman liturgy’ and to be given ‘pride of place’, thus rests on deep theological foundations. This is often expressed as, ‘*lex orandi, lex credendi*’, meaning that the way the Church prays, shapes and expresses what she believes. Whether singing as a member of the congregation, or otherwise as a member of the choir singing specialised chants, singing is a part of the call and response that is fundamental to full and real participation in the sacred actions of the heavenly liturgy.
