## AUSTRALIAN CATHOLIC BISHOPS CONFERENCE CENSUS – ST. ANNE'S RESULTS

Attendance data was collected at St. Anne's for four Sundays starting on May 3<sup>rd</sup> and finishing on May 24<sup>th</sup>. The average overall attendance for the four Sunday Masses was 420 people, an average of 105 people per Mass. The 7:30am Mass was on the highest attending Mass over the four-week period averaging 175 people. On the 17<sup>th</sup> of May data on gender was also recorded. Of the 403 community members who attended that day, 55.3% of attendees were male and 44.7% were female. Men outnumbering women in this church counters previous trends in Australia, and the the Archdiocese of Perth, where woman attendance is greater. On May 24<sup>th</sup>, age was recorded and results are shown in Figure I. Most (58.7%) of the 404 community members who attended that day were categorised as 30 or under. In summary, St. Anne's has a unique congregation profile where a higher number of males and more younger people attend Mass.

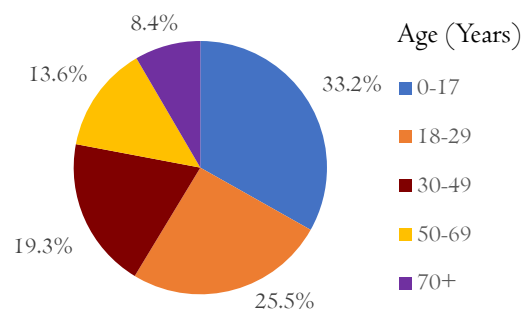


Figure I: St. Anne's age profile from Sunday May 24<sup>th</sup>

## ST. ANNE'S MUSIC

The Mass setting for the External Solemnity of Corpus Christi is **Mass VIII** with **Credo III**. The Mass setting on the following Sunday will be **Mass XI** with **Credo I**. The **Asperges Me** and **Salve Regina** will be sung on both Sundays, as is usual on Sundays after Pentecost. **Everyone is invited to join in all the sections in the booklets marked in bold.**

**Music & Liturgy: Should a choir have a particular physical location in a Catholic church?**

To answer this question, it is helpful to take the long view. The word *choir*, derived ultimately from Ancient Greek, came to refer both to the singers in a church and to the architectural space where they sang. Through Old French (*cuer* or *quer*) and Middle English (*quire*), the term developed into the modern English *choir*. The fact that the same word refers both to the singers and to their place within the church is our first clue that these two realities have always been closely connected.

Throughout the history of the Catholic Church, a specific place has always been set aside for the choir, reflecting the choir's integral role in the liturgy. As readers of this column will know, singing is not merely an adornment of the liturgy but an essential part of its structure. Historically, a Mass could not be celebrated in its fullest form without a choir. Indeed, the High Mass has long been regarded as the normative and complete expression of the Roman Rite. While the specific location of the choir has changed (from its earlier form in the sanctuary to later forms in lofts and chapels outside it), the fundamental principle that it is necessary to set aside a specific location for the

choir has been a consistent feature of church architecture through the centuries.

Just as the sanctuary is a space reserved for a particular liturgical purpose, so too the choir has traditionally occupied a dedicated place within the church building. This location was chosen to allow the choir to fulfil its role without disturbing the congregation, while also providing a location in which the singers could focus on the often complex and increasingly difficult liturgical repertoires that were its own.

The placement of the choir has had a significant influence on the development of musical styles and therefore the entire treasury of Catholic music. Just as a Haydn string quartet is inconceivable beyond the confines of a well-proportioned drawing room, so too is it implausible to think that the Church's rich repertoire of plainchant and sacred polyphony could have developed without its resonant buildings and dedicated spaces for choirs. The divergent traditions of other Christian denominations, in which the position and function of the choir are fundamentally different, only serve to reinforce this point.

Why, then, does there not appear to be a dedicated choir space at St Anne's? Further research is needed, but it seems that St Anne's, opened in 1914, was only partially completed—the sanctuary itself was never added to the nave—and may have been conceived primarily as a small church intended for Low Mass rather than the normative forms of liturgical celebration.
