ST ANNE'S NOTICES



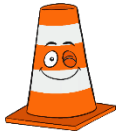

St. Anne's relic will be venerated at the conclusion of the 9:30am Sung Mass.

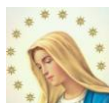

ST. ANNE'S MUSIC

The Mass setting for the Eighth Sunday after Pentecost is **Mass XI** with **Credo I**. The Mass setting changes to **Mass VIII** with **Credo III** for the feast of St. Anne. The **Asperges Me** and **Salve Regina** will be sung as usual at both Masses. **Everyone is invited to join in all the sections in the booklets marked in bold.**

Music & Liturgy: Why do some parts of the sung Mass feel "easy" to join in, while others really need a specialist choir? (Continued from last bulletin. Answer starts on back page)

Singing the Church's own music for the fuller forms of the liturgy requires serious commitment from an entire worshipping community. While the congregation must take its own part and learn the fixed music of the Mass Ordinary, a member of a liturgical choir needs to grow in skills such as sightreading and recognising intervals, so that the chant really is sung liturgical prayer—prayed with confidence—much as a reader turns written words into fluent speech, or the priest prays his parts.

This is a high level of skill required for a choir member – and it is precisely the kind of skill that generations of congregations, monks, nuns, and parish choirs have developed over time, where there has been both desire and sustained commitment.

Given the high level of skill required, in many times and places, cathedrals, parishes and even families have sought to provide a certain stability for those entrusted with singing the Ordinary. Experienced singers were sometimes appointed so that the Church's sung prayer could be offered with consistency from week to week. This was to ensure that the more intricate parts of the liturgy were carried faithfully and prayerfully.

A small, well-prepared core of singers, able to commit themselves steadily to this work, can serve the whole community by helping to make these chants a living and regular part of the liturgy.

Where such commitment is recognised and supported, tradition suggests that the fruits are lasting: a richer liturgical life, the rites carried out fully and faithfully, a deeper familiarity with the Church's liturgical prayer.
