ST. ANNE'S ANNUAL COMMUNITY MEETING: Fr. Limbourn and the St. Anne's committee would like to welcome all St. Anne's community members to the Annual Community Meeting at 1:00pm on Saturday, **July 25th**. The meeting will discuss upcoming events at St. Anne's as well as touch upon the progress of the last two years. There will be an opportunity for questions from the floor before the close of the meeting.



HOLY FACE OF JESUS DEVOTION: Occurs on the first Tuesday of every month. The primary purpose of the devotion to Jesus' Holy Face is to make reparation for sins against the first three Commandments: The denial of God (atheism/communism); blasphemy, and the profanation of Sundays and Holy Days. This devotion is also a weapon against Freemasonry. Devotion will be on **Tuesday, July 7th** at 4.00pm followed by Benediction, Rosary, and Mass at 5:30pm.



BROWN SCAPULAR ENROLMENT: Enrolments for the Brown Scapular will be taking place after each Mass on Sunday, **July 12th** and after the Mass of Our Lady Carmel on Thursday, **July 16th**. The origin of the Brown Scapular came when Our Lady appeared to St. Simon Stock – on July 16th, 1251 – and said that those wearing the brown scapular when they die will not suffer eternal fire. The scapular is a sign of devotion, rather than a good luck charm, and requires prayer and good works. If one is interested, they can devote themselves to the Sabbatine Privilege which consists of:

1. Wearing the Brown Scapular
2. Living a chaste life (married or not married)
3. One of either
 - a. Daily Prayer of either the Little Office or Divine Office.
 - b. Abstain from meat on Wednesdays and Saturdays (in addition to fast days prescribed by the Church).
 - c. Pray the 5 decades of the Holy Rosary daily or other good works (priest permission required)

PROPERTY WORKS AT ST ANNE'S: Many works have taken place at St. Anne's during June and are continuing over July:

1. **Presbytery:** The Archdiocese of Perth property tradesmen have continued works on the presbytery bathroom. Works on the laundry and confessional will begin soon. This work is being completed so the property meets safeguarding standards.
2. **Southern Carpark:** Soak wells have been installed and the asphalt has been laid. Arrows and speed bumps have been installed to help with traffic flow and safety.
3. **Outside Shelter:** Blinds are now installed on the outside shelter of the church to protect community members from strong winds and rains during Mass.
4. **Garden:** St. Anne's have bought trees and will be planted throughout the grounds of St. Anne's during the coming fortnight.



VEILS AVAILABLE: There were a few veils left in the lost property which was cleared on Wednesday, July 1st. If you do not have a veil and would like to possess one, please come to the sacristy. There are eight available. Our Lady is always depicted with a veil because her womb housed Our Blessed Lord. Before the Second Vatican Council, women were required to veil during Mass as sign of humility and reverence to Our Lord but is no longer required under the 1983 Canon law.

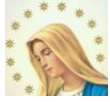

ST. ANNE'S MUSIC

The Mass setting for the next two Sundays is **Mass XI** with **Credo I**. The **Asperges Me** and **Salve Regina** will be sung as usual. **Everyone is invited to join in all the sections in the booklets marked in bold.**

Music & Liturgy: Why do some parts of the sung Mass feel "easy" to join in, while others really need a specialist choir?

It has been the constant teaching of the Church in modern times that the whole congregation should take its rightful part in the singing of the Mass. The good news is that, for most people, this is quite manageable. For example, Mass XI is sung around twenty-five times each year, and the Salve Regina is also heard regularly. At St Anne's, you, the congregation, have clearly made these sung prayers your own, and this is a great encouragement.

The other chants of the Mass—the Introit, Gradual, Alleluia or Tract, Offertory, and Communion—are ordinarily sung by a dedicated choir because they change on a weekly basis. They also require significant skill not just to sing, but to sing to a good standard.


Importantly, these chants began their life in the liturgy as sung prayers. For centuries they were sung, refined, memorised, and sung again; this is how they were handed on in monasteries and cathedrals. Only later were they written down as words and into musical notation, in order to preserve a repertoire that already existed in performance. In other words, the chant we see today on the page is a sketch of a living, sung tradition.


Because of this history, the Roman Rite presupposes the presence of a choir capable of singing these liturgical chants for Sung and High Mass. Given that the full set of Proper chants for a Sunday can take around twenty minutes to sing without mistakes, it is natural that they demand serious preparation. To be continued...
