**HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION:** All faithful are reminded that the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary on Saturday, **August 15<sup>th</sup>** is a Holy Day of Obligation. There are two Masses scheduled on Saturday, as well as the Vigil Mass the night before, to help community members meet their obligation. **There will be a single collection during the offertory at each Mass.** Money raised from this collection will be divided equally between the Community Account, Music Account, and St Matthew's Fundraising Account. You are welcome to bring herbs to the Mass as they will be blessed with Chartres relic after each mass.

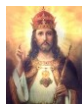

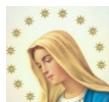

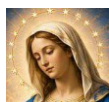

## ST. ANNE'S MUSIC

The Mass setting for the next two Sundays is **Mass XI** with **Credo I**. The **Asperges Me** and **Salve Regina** will be sung as usual. **Everyone is invited to join in all the sections in the booklets marked in bold.**

### **Music & Liturgy: Learning to Hear the Sung Mass. Part I – The Word Clothed in Melody**

One of the most remarkable features of Gregorian chant is that it was never intended simply to make the words of Scripture more beautiful. It was intended to help us pray them.

We are accustomed today to thinking of music as something added to words. A composer writes a tune, then chooses a text that fits its rhythm and mood. Gregorian chant works in almost exactly the opposite direction. The sacred text comes first. The melody grows from it, following its accents, dwelling upon its meaning, and allowing it to unfold gradually before the listener.

The monks who preserved the chant traditions over many centuries did not think of themselves primarily as composers. They were readers of Scripture. Long before a melody was written down, the biblical text had been prayed, meditated upon and sung in the Divine Office and the Mass. The music was the fruit of that contemplation.

Dom Eugène Cardine, perhaps the greatest Gregorian scholar of the twentieth century, wrote that the role of Gregorian melody is to “decorate the text, to interpret it and to help the hearer assimilate it.” This observation has profound consequences. The melody is not independent of the words; it exists because of them. Every rise, every moment of repose, every extended melisma serves the sacred text rather than competing with it.

This is especially true of the Proper chants of the Mass: the Introit, Gradual, Alleluia (or Tract), Offertory and Communion. They are themselves part of the Church’s proclamation of the Scriptures appointed for that day, alongside the Epistle and Gospel.

To hear them well therefore requires a small change in perspective. Instead of asking, “Do I enjoy this music” we might ask, “What is this melody inviting me to notice in the text?”

The answer is often surprising. A single word may be allowed to blossom into an elaborate musical phrase. Another may pass almost unnoticed. Joy, longing, confidence and supplication are expressed not by adding emotion to the text, but by allowing the text itself to shape the melody.
