ST. ANNE'S MUSIC

The Mass setting for the next two Sundays is **Mass IV** with **Credo I**. The **Asperges Me** and **Salve Regina** will be sung as usual. **Everyone is invited to join in all the sections in the booklets marked in bold.**

Music & Liturgy: Learning to Hear the Sung Mass. Part IV – The Gradual: The Church's Longest Meditation

If one Proper chant deserves to be called the musical heart of the Sung Mass, it is surely the Gradual. For many modern Catholics, it is also the most puzzling.

Why is it so elaborate? Why does it linger over almost every phrase? Why does it demand so much of the choir? The answer lies in where it falls.

The Gradual follows immediately after the Epistle. The Church has just listened to the Word of God, and rather than moving straight to the Gospel, she pauses — not with silence alone, but with contemplation.

The Gradual is not simply another reading, nor a hymn inserted between readings. It is the Church's response to what she has just heard: a prolonged meditation upon the Word before she is led to the Gospel. This is why its melodies are among the richest in the entire repertoire. The Church is in no hurry. Having heard the Scriptures proclaimed, she allows them to echo through the soul before proceeding.

Amalarius of Metz, writing in the ninth century, saw the chants between the readings as the Church's response to the divine Word. His

liturgical interpretations are often imaginative, but his instinct here is profound: revelation is not merely announced; it must also be received. The Gradual embodies that reception.

Notice how often the melody seems almost reluctant to leave an important word. It circles back, lingers, and allows the word to resonate before moving on. Modern ears sometimes mistake this for ornamentation. The medieval Church understood it differently — this was meditation in sound.

There is a lesson here for us. We often approach Scripture impatiently, eager to reach the next verse, the next chapter, the next idea. The liturgy teaches another rhythm: it bids us remain a while with a single sentence, until it has begun to shape our hearts.

Perhaps this explains why the Gradual is so demanding to sing. Its difficulty is not for difficulty's sake; its richness reflects the depth of the contemplation it expresses. When the choir sings the Gradual, they do so on behalf of the whole congregation, giving musical voice to the Church's meditation upon the Word she has just received.

At St Anne's, we try to give the Gradual and Alleluia their due within the limits of what a small choir can offer each week. We are not always able to sing them entire from the *Graduale*, but wherever possible we set the text to a more elaborate melody, in keeping with their place in the liturgy.
