ST. ANNE'S MUSIC

The Mass setting for the next two Sundays is **Mass IV** with **Credo I**. The **Asperges Me** and **Salve Regina** will be sung as usual. **Everyone is invited to join in all the sections in the booklets marked in bold.**

Music & Liturgy: Learning to Hear the Sung Mass. Part III – Gregorian Chant as sung *Lectio Divina*

The ancient monks had a beautiful way of reading Scripture. They called it *lectio divina* — "divine reading."

Unlike ordinary study, its purpose was not primarily to gain information. One read slowly, attentively, and prayerfully. A single phrase might be repeated several times. One particular word might capture the imagination and become the subject of prolonged meditation. Gradually, meditation gave way to prayer, and prayer to silent contemplation.

Something remarkably similar happens in Gregorian chant.

Consider what happens when a biblical verse is sung according to the ancient melodies of the Roman Rite. The text no longer passes at the speed of ordinary speech. Certain words are expanded into flowing melismas. Others are given moments of repose. The melody encourages us to linger where the sacred text itself invites lingering.

This is not musical decoration. It is theological reflection expressed through melody.

Dom Joseph Gajard of Solesmes described Gregorian chant as "the official commentary of liturgical texts, authentically given by the Church herself" (Gajard, cited by CUA Dept. of Music). That is an illuminating description. The chant does not merely carry Scripture — it interprets it, not by changing the words, but by suggesting where and how to dwell, rejoice, plead, and adore.

One sees this particularly in the great Alleluias. After the final syllable comes the jubilus: a long, wordless melody. St Augustine, commenting on the Psalms, described this kind of wordless singing as the sound of a heart so full of joy that ordinary words could no longer hold it (Augustine, *Enarrationes in Psalmos* 32, 99). Here the music does what words alone cannot. It carries praise beyond language itself.

The chants of the Proper of the Mass remind us that the liturgy is not simply a sequence of texts to be read as efficiently as possible. It is an encounter with the living Word — the Logos, Christ. Like the monks before them, the Church refuses to hurry through this encounter.

Perhaps this is why the Proper chants have nourished generations of Christians. They do not merely tell us what Scripture says. They teach us how to pray it.
